BILL SUMMARY

Summary Synopsis:

The bill specifically allocates \$50,000 for the purposes of funding a program to provide community re-entry assistance to criminal offenders in specific neighborhoods of Albuquerque. The types of programs contemplated include job skills and training and job placement services. The bill states that the money would be used to contract with “a community organization” to provide the contemplated services.

Given the comparatively small amount of money designated to be allocated by this bill, the question comes to mind as to how many offenders could actually be provided with quality services if the total funding is only \$50,000. If this amount of money is going to be used as matching funds for some other source of funding (perhaps federal grant funds?) then these allocated funds might be stretched further.

Unless “a community organization” has already been identified to provide the contemplated services, there may be difficulties in finding a competent organization to provide the services for this limited funding amount. If a specific “community organization” has already been identified, it might be best to identify that organization within the bill language.
