This analysis is neither a formal Attorney General’s Opinion nor an Attorney General’s Advisory Opinion Letter. This is a staff analysis in response to the agency’s, committee’s or legislator’s request.

**BILL SUMMARY**

This legislation proposes reducing the annual appropriation to the legislative retirement fund under NMSA 1978, Section 7-1-6.43 by \$125,000 - from \$200,000 to \$75,000. The legislation proposes a corresponding amount in new funding for education, namely, by allocating \$83,333 to fund an increase in the minimum salary for level one teachers from \$30,000 to \$33,000 annually (see NMSA 1978, Section 22-10A-7(G)), by allocating \$20,833 to the Public Education Department (“PED”) to “provide training to licensed school officials in the detection and reporting of child abuse or neglect,” and by allocating \$20,833 to PED “to provide training to public school employees in school firearm violence prevention and...security.”
