BILL SUMMARY

Summary Synopsis: HB 82 would prohibit former statewide elected officials, former public regulation commissioners, former state legislators and former cabinet secretaries from engaging in lobbying for compensation for a period of two calendar years after service in those capacities. Similarly, the employer of a lobbyist affected by this Bill would be prohibited from compensating that lobbyist. Violation of the prohibitions is made a misdemeanor offense.

HB 82 would apply to all persons who hold the office of statewide elected official, public regulation commissioner, state legislator or cabinet secretary on or after July 1, 2014.
