BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

The Senate Rules Committee amendments to Senate Bill 364 made the following amendments to the original bill:

1. Adds language providing that if the provisions of the bill give rise to a conflict between the statutory provisions governing general elections and those governing municipal elections, the provisions governing general elections shall be used.
2. Inserts a new section of the bill containing amendments to §3-8-27 of the Municipal Election Code that move back various deadlines by seven days, including deadlines for candidate filing and candidate certification.
3. Inserts a new section of the bill containing an amendment to §3-8-29(A) of the Municipal Election Code that moves back by three days the deadline for the drawing by lot to determine the order by which candidates appear on the ballot.
