This bill expressly preempts the authority of municipalities, counties, and zoning commissions to adopt ordinances or resolutions that regulate agricultural operations, mining activities, and oil and gas activities and vests such authority exclusively in the State.

The changes to Sections 3-21-1(A) and 21-21-21 NMSA 1978 that this bill proposes may remove all zoning authority relating to regulate agricultural operations, mining activities, and oil and gas activities from local authorities. There do not appear to be state entities that have such authority by statute, so it is possible the result would be no zoning authority over these activities by any level of government.
