BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SJR 19 was submitted by the Legislative Committee on Compacts pursuant to the Compact Negotiation Act, NMSA 1978, §§ 11-13A-1 to -5 (1999, as amended through 2007). SJR 19, if adopted by the Legislature, would approve proposed tribal-state class III gaming compacts negotiated between the Governor and the Navajo Nation, the Jicarilla Apache Nation, the Mescalero Apache Tribe, the Pueblo of Acoma and the Pueblo of Jemez. If SJR 19 is adopted, Compact Negotiation Act will authorize the Governor to execute additional compacts identical to those specified in SJR 19 without submitting the additional, identical compacts to the Legislature for approval.
